September 2010 Hikes

Please note that September departure times are moved to 9:00 a.m. Hikers will meet across from the post office at the South end of the Rite Aid parking lot. Transportation is by car-pooling. We recommend a donation of \$4 to \$6 depending on the distance traveled to offset transportation costs. Please bring a spare pair of shoes for traveling as well as plenty of drinking water, food, sunscreen, insect repellent and a personal first-aid kit. The hikes are generally full day trips. Small children and dogs are not allowed on the hikes. Scheduled hike locations and leaders are subject to change. Tues. Sept. 7^t No hike due to Labor Day Weekend.

Sat. Sept. 11th Kennally Creek/Needles Summit/Blackmare Lake Overlook. Advanced hike, 14 miles RT, elevation gain 2435'. Hike Leader: Roberta Thompson

Sunday, Sept. 12th The end of the season social will be held at the Woodlands Clubhouse at 2:00 p.m. More information will be sent at a later date.

Tues. Sept. 14th Lake Fork Campground/Boulder Lake Crossover. Advanced hike, 10.75 miles one way, elevation gain: Boulder Reservoir to summit 1471', Lake Fork Campground to summit 2464'. One group will start at Lake Fork Campground, the other group will start at Boulder Reservoir. The two groups will meet halfway and exchange car keys. There are two stream crossings so river shoes are recommended. Hike Leaders: Tom Derieg (Lake Fork Campground trailhead) Bill Starowicz (Boulder Reservoir trailhead).

Sat. Sept. 18th Duck Lake (Goose Lake Road access) Easy hike, 2 miles RT, elevation gain 250'. Hike Leader: Roberta Thompson

Tues. Sept. 21st Clayburn Trailhead to Upper and Lower Twin lakes, Hard Butte Lake, Rainbow Lake. Moderate hike, distance to be determined by hikers. Distance to Rainbow Lake is 7 miles RT with an elevation loss of 250'. Distance to Lower Twin Lakes and Hard Butte Lake is 7.5 miles RT from the trailhead. Clayburn Trailhead is 6907', Warm Spring Saddle is 7303' and 2.5 miles from the trailhead. This is where hikers will decide to go to Rainbow Lake another mile south with an elevation loss of 250' or continue on to Twin Lakes and Hard Butte Lake to the west another 1.2 miles from the saddle with an elevation gain of 490'. Hikers may choose to do all four lakes. Hike Leader: Tom Derieg

Sat. Sept. 25th Horton Lake. Moderate hike, distance 4.7 miles RT, elevation gain 600'. This is a new hike for our club. The trail starts near Granite Lake. One third of the hike follows an old road closed to traffic, one third is a faint trail and one third is bushwhacking. Hike Leader: Janis Seufert

Tues. Sept 28th Lava Buttes Overlook/Crossover. Moderate hike, distance 6.5 miles one way, elevation gain approximately 700'. One group will start at the Clayburn Trailhead, road 257, the other group will start at the trailhead off road 308. Hikers will exchange car keys and hike to the opposite trailhead.
